Original dated 29/3/2018	<ol> <li>To manage the impacts of the action on the environment, the person taking the action must implement the conditions of the SA approval.</li> </ol>
Original dated 29/3/2018	<ol> <li>The person taking the action must not impact more than 1740 hectares of Plains Rat habitat within the disturbance footprint.</li> </ol>
Original dated 29/3/2018	<ul> <li>3) Prior to commencement of the action, to compensate for residual impacts to the Plains Rat, the person taking the action must acquire an offset property which must contain:         <ul> <li>a population of the Plains Rat</li> <li>b. no less than 1740 hectares of Plains Rat habitat</li> <li>c. habitat quality equal to that of the Plains Rat habitat within the disturbance footprint.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Original dated 29/3/2018	<ol> <li>The person taking the action must maintain or improve the habitat quality of the existing Plains Rat habitat at the acquired offset property for the life of this approval.</li> </ol>
Original dated 29/3/2018	5) Within 2 years from commencement of the action, the person taking the action must change the tenure of the offset property for conservation purposes using an appropriate legal mechanism for long term protection.
Original dated 29/3/2018	6) Prior to the commencement of the action, the person taking the action must engage a suitably qualified expert to undertake a Night Parrot survey within the development envelope. The Night Parrot survey must be undertaken in' accordance with the EPBC Act Night Parrot survey guidelines. Within three months of the Night Parrot survey being completed, the person taking the action must provide the Department with the Night Parrot survey results.
Original dated 29/3/2018	7) Should the Night Parrot or evidence of the Night Parrot be recorded during the survey, the person taking the action must submit for the Minister's approval, a Night Parrot Management Plan that must include:
	<ul> <li>Details of the Night Parrot survey results, including the methodology, timing and area surveyed.</li> </ul>
	b. An assessment of the impacts to the Night Parrot that will result from the action.
	<ul> <li>Management actions that will avoid, minimise and/or offset both the immediate and long-term impacts of the action on the Night Parrot.</li> </ul>



Original dated 29/3/2018	8) Prior to the commencement of the action, the person taking the action must engage a suitably qualified expert to undertake a Frankenia plicata survey within the development envelope. The Frankenia plicata survey must be undertaken in accordance with contemporary survey methods. Within three months of the Frankenia plicata survey being completed, the person taking the action must provide the Department with the Frankenia plicata survey results.
Original dated 29/3/2018	9) Should the Frankenia plicata be recorded during the survey, the person taking the action must submit for the Minister's approval, a Frankenia plicata Management Plan that must include:
	<ul> <li>Details of the <i>Frankenia plicata</i> survey results, including the methodology, timing and area surveyed.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>An assessment of the impacts to the Frankenia plicata that will result from the action.</li> </ul>
	c. Management actions that will avoid, minimise and/or offset both the immediate and long-term impacts of the action on the <i>Frankenia plicata</i> .
	<ul> <li>Monitoring and reporting requirements that demonstrate the management actions are effectively being implemented and achieve the intended results. This should include the frequency, intensity and duration of monitoring.</li> </ul>
	The person taking the action must not <b>commence</b> the action prior to the <b>Minister</b> approving the <b>Frankenia plicata</b> Management Plan. The approved <b>Frankenia plicata</b> Management Plan must be implemented.
Original dated 29/3/2018	10) Within 3 months following the change of tenure referred to in condition 5) the person taking the action must provide the <b>Department</b> with written evidence that the offset property has been secured for conservation purposes using an appropriate legal mechanism.
Original dated 29/3/2018	11) Within 30 days after the <b>commencement</b> of the action, the person taking the action must advise the <b>Department</b> in writing of the actual date of commencement.
Original dated 29/3/2018	12) The person taking the action must maintain accurate records substantiating all activities associated with or relevant to the conditions of approval, and make them available upon request to the Department. Such records may be subject to audit by the Department or an independent auditor in accordance with section 458 of the EPBC Act, or used to verify compliance with the conditions of approval. Summaries of audits will be posted on the Department's website. The results of audits may also be publicised through the general media.
Original dated 29/3/2018	13) Within 30 days after completion of the action, the person taking the action must advise the Department in writing of the actual date of completion and provide a map clearly defining the date, location and

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	actual impact within the <b>Disturbance footprint</b> of the action and be accompanied with a <b>shapefile</b> .
As varied on the date of this notice	14) The approval holder must prepare a compliance report for each 12 month period following the date of commencement of the action, or as otherwise agreed to in writing by the Minister. The approval holder must:
	<ul> <li>a) publish each compliance report on the website within 60 business days following the relevant 12 month period;</li> </ul>
	<li>b) notify the <b>Department</b> by email that a compliance report has been published on the website within five business days of the date of publication;</li>
	<ul> <li>keep all compliance reports publicly available on the website until this approval expires;</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>exclude or redact sensitive ecological data from compliance reports published on the website; and</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>e) where any sensitive ecological data has been excluded from the version published, submit the full compliance report to the Department within 5 business days of publication.</li> </ul>
	<b>Note</b> : The first <b>compliance report</b> may report a period less than 12 months so that it and subsequent compliance reports align with the similar requirement under state approval.
Original dated 29/3/2018	15) Upon the direction of the Minister, the person taking the action must ensure that an independent audit of compliance with the conditions of approval is conducted and a report submitted to the Minister. The independent auditor must be approved by the Minister prior to the commencement of the audit. Audit criteria must be agreed to by the Minister and the audit report must address the criteria to the satisfaction of the Minister.
Original dated 29/3/2018	16) If, at any time after 5 years from the date of this approval, the person taking the action has not <b>commenced</b> the action, then the person taking the action must not <b>commence</b> the action without the written agreement of the <b>Minister</b> .
As varied on the date of this notice	17) The approval holder must notify the <b>Department</b> in writing of any: incident; non-compliance with the conditions; or non-compliance with the commitments made in <b>plans</b> . The notification must be given as soon as practicable and no later than two <b>business days</b> after becoming aware of the incident or non-compliance. The notification must specify:
	a) the condition which is or may be in breach; and
	b) a short description of the incident and/or non-compliance.

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As varied on the date of this notice	18) The approval holder must provide to the <b>Department</b> the details of any incident or non-compliance with the conditions or commitments made in <b>plans</b> as soon as practicable and no later than 30 days after becoming aware of the <b>incident</b> or non-compliance, specifying:
	<ul> <li>any corrective action or investigation which the approval holder has already taken or intends to take in the immediate future;</li> </ul>
	b) the potential impacts of the incident or non-compliance; and
	<ul> <li>c) the method and timing of any remedial action that will be undertaken by the approval holder.</li> </ul>

	<b>Commencement, commenced, commence:</b> The construction of any infrastructure, excluding fences, signage, and Advanced Exploration Activities Excluded from Referral 2017/7895 as shown in the figure at <u>Attachment A</u> .
	Completion is the day after the mine has been rehabilitated as required by the SA approval.
	Compliance report: means written reports:
	<ol> <li>providing accurate and complete details of compliance, incidents and non-compliance with the conditions and the plans;</li> </ol>
	ii. consistent with the <b>Department's</b> Annual Compliance Report Guidelines (2014)
	<li>iii. include a shapefile of any clearance of any protected matters, of their habitat, undertaken within the relevant 12 month period; and</li>
	annexing a schedule of all <b>plans</b> prepared and in existence in relation to the condition during the relevant 12 month period
	<b>Department:</b> The Australian Government Department or any other agency administering the <b>EPBC Act</b> from time to time.
	Disturbance footprint: as defined in the figure at Attachment A.
	Environment: as defined by section 528 of the EPBC Act.
	<b>EPBC Act:</b> Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (Cth).
	Frankenia plicata: is the EPBC Act listed Frankenia plicata.
	Habitat quality: is the ecological condition of the offset property that enables the Plains Rat to persist in the area.
	Incident: means any event which has the potential to, or does, impact on protected matter(s).

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	Minister: The Minister administering the EPBC Act and includes a delegate of the Minister.
	Night Parrot: is the EPBC Act listed Pezoporus occidentalis.
	Offset attributes: is an excel file ('.xls') capturing relevant attributes of the offset property, including the corresponding EPBC Act reference ID number, the physical address of the offset property, coordinates of the boundary points in decimal degrees, the protected matters for which the offset property compensates, any additional EPBC Act protected matters that are benefiting from the offset property, the size of the offset property in hectares and the legal mechanism used to protect and conserve the offset property.
	Offset property: an area of land located within a 100 km radius of the disturbance footprint.
	<b>Plans:</b> means any of the documents required to be prepared, approved by the <b>Minister</b> , and/or implemented by the approval holder and published on the <b>website</b> in accordance with these conditions (includes action management plans and/or strategies)
	Plains Rat habitat: large open gypseous cracking clay areas associated with minor drainage features, and depressions within gibber stony plains.
	Plains Rat: is the EPBC Act listed Pseudomys australis.
	Population: a number of Plains Rat individuals among which interbreeding occurs.
	<b>SA approval:</b> means the SA Minister for Mineral Resources and Energy Approval (record number 2017D054379) or as varied by the SA Minister for Mineral Resources and Energy and the recommended conditions as stated in the four Tenement Documents (ML6471, MLP152, MLP153, and MLP154) excluding Second Schedule condition 27 of ML6471.
	Shapefile: is an ESRI shapefile containing '.shp', '.shx' and '.dbf' files and other files capturing attributes of the Disturbance footprint and Offset Property, including the shape, EPBC Act reference ID number and protected matters present at the relevant site. Attributes should also be captured in '.xls' format.
	Suitably qualified expert: is a person with relevant tertiary qualifications and a minimum of ten (10) years demonstrated experience as a botanist or ecologist in a relevant field of natural science.
	<b>Survey guidelines:</b> is the Survey guidelines for Australia's threatened birds: Guidelines for detecting birds listed as threatened under the EPBC Act (Department of the Environment, Water, Heritage and the Arts, 2010 - Erratum April 2017).
	Written evidence: must include a description of the offset property, including the amount of Plains Rat habitat, the habitat quality, a map clearly defining the location and boundaries of the offset property and be accompanied with offset attributes and a shapefile.
